There are now only 10 school days left in Term One. Congratulations to students, staff and families for the way that we have worked together in these COVID times. The attitude of our students and staff has been truly remarkably positive.

Thank you to everyone for increasing our levels of booster COVID vaccination. We need to remain vigilant in matters of sanitization and wearing of masks in some situations.

I notice that we are not looking at infection numbers as much as we were in 2020 and 2021. However, it is a good idea to note daily trends. Over the last 24 hours in Victoria, there were 3394 PCR test results and 6865 RAT test results. There were 244 people in hospital, 15 in Intensive Care and 11 people unfortunately died.

Our Programs and Student Review (PSR) meetings will be held by WebEx next Thursday, 31st March. I encourage all parents and guardians to participate in these most important discussions.


MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS—MSA ZONES OF REGULATION

Students linked their characters to a zone and explored different emotions. Well done, MSA!


