MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS — WALKER STREET GALLERY

On Thursday 20th of October, a small group of Middle School Art students attended the Walker Street Gallery in Dandenong. The current exhibition *Surveyed* explores how we adapt to our changing environment.

Artist Harley Manifold paints scenes of the streets of Greater Dandenong. Giordano Biondi offers clay models of imagined cities. Amaya Iturri transforms landscapes with bold colour. Together, these artists provide a recording of the City of Greater Dandenong.

Students gallery tour began with an exploration of historical survey photos, maps and drawings. Riley correctly guessed the photos of Holden cars being made in a Dandenong factory were from the late 1950s. Inspecting smaller photos with a magnifying glass, Mustafa found Holden produced 2 million cars on March 3rd 1969. The first car made at the Dandenong Holden plant was an FE Holden made on September 19, 1956. Do you know when the last Holden car was made?

Students considered paintings, sculptures, and videos, before beginning their own painting about *place*.
