

VISUAL ART NEWS — PARALLEL WILDS-ECHO CALL LAUNCH

Over several weeks, students from Emerson's two campuses met via Webex with multi-media artist Craig Dent. He took them on a journey of storytelling through creative writing, multi-media and film making. The project, Parallel Wilds-Echo Call, included an excursion to Heritage Hill, Dandenong as well as a visit from artist and photographer Justin Dallinger and his collection of film and photographic equipment which included a 3D camera, VR headsets, and many more.

Parallel Wilds-Echo Call culminated with a launch on 2nd November, and we were fortunate to host Deputy Mayor Cr Eden Foster and Councilor Angela Long at the event. 'Parallel Wilds' is a collaboration between Emerson and Young Somerset, UK. Our episode is set in the year 2050, where the central character, Ngarey, must navigate through new and unfamiliar territory to ensure her future survival.

The students benefitted both educationally and personally from the project and it was great to see them take ownership of the project from the beginning through their imagining of a future world and contributing ideas for the plot, conducting research and attending site visits to Heritage Hill, Dandenong.
