We have recently been informed that our Minister for Education and Training, The Hon. Natalie Hutchins, has approved for Emerson School to make a contribution to Stage Two of our modernization program. This will enable the construction of a Technology wing to accommodate Automotive Students and Wood Technology for our Junior and Senior students.

Architects have been invited to apply for a design role. This process will be finished by the first week in December. The appointed architect will then commence on architectural documentation. It is hoped that Stage Two will go to tender just as Stage One is drawing to completion.

We are very grateful for the Minister's decision to progress our four stage modernization project. This building vision is urgently needed to provide the facilities that our stimulating learning programs require.

On a practical note, the pouring of the concrete floor of the first storey of our Stage One building will be completed tomorrow.


