PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The continued development of Stage One of our modernization is central to many conversations both at Emerson and in the local community. It is projected that the school be given occupation of the new building in late May (approximately Week 6, Term 2).

We will be having a Curriculum Day on Friday, 24th February. This will coincide with the installation of digital, fibre optic and NBN connections to the new building. In order to do this, both campuses of our school will be without any digital or landline phone connections for that day. All landline calls will be diverted to a mobile phone on that day. If the connections are not complete on 24th February, the work will continue over the weekend to ensure that all is ready for normal operations on Monday, 27th February.

At our School Council meeting last Tuesday night, various celebrations for our 50th Anniversary were discussed. These will be conducted in Term 4 of this year. We will keep all community members updated of these exciting developments.

How We Play

Duration: 90 minutes of games-based activities and instructional learning.

Sessions include:

- small-sided games that allow for high involvement
- games with modified rules, area and equipment to promote inclusion and prompt understanding

Team Play This encourages players to work in a team to score a goal or point. These skills can be used in sports like football, basketball and netball.

Target Play This encourages hand-eye coordination as players aim an object towards a target. These skills can be used in sports like bowling, golf and bocce.

Movement This promotes the development of rhythmic and expressive skills. These skills can be used in sports like dancing, gymnastics, athletics, swimming and skiing.

Net and Court Games This encourages hand-eye coordination as players propel an object into space. These skills can be used in sports like tennis, table tennis and badminton.

Batting and Fielding Games This encourages hand-eye coordination as players strike an object and avoid getting caught by other players. These skills can be used in sports like cricket, baseball and softball.
