At last Friday's whole School Assembly, I introduced Margaret Wedd. Margaret is the daughter of Les Emerson after whom our school is named. It was wonderful to hear Margaret reflecting on her father's career and the great honour that he felt when our school was named after him. Les was the Director of Special Services in our Department of Education from 1968 until his retirement in 1976. One of his great achievements was the establishment of many new Specialist Schools to provide the options and choice that we have today. It was Les Emerson who asked me to take on the role of Executive Officer at the Krongold Centre, Monash University.



Margaret was impressed by the way Emerson School has never stood still in offering additional learning opportunities for our students. It was the first time she had visited both campuses.
