Our Victorian Government has responded to the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with Disabilities.

Recommendation 7.14 – Phasing out and ending Special/Segregated Education


I am pleased to announce that our Victorian Government has rejected Recommendation 7.14.

The Victorian Government values the role Specialist Schools play in the education system. It will continue to provide parents and carers with the choice of enrolling their child in a school that is right for them – whether that is in an inclusive local school or a specialist school.

The Victorian Government recognises that inclusion does not mean 'a one size fits all' approach to education.

I would like to congratulate our Government for this visionary statement. Emerson School makes a massive difference in the lives of our students. It is important that parents and students have this option in the years ahead.
