School Sores at Emerson School.

Emerson has had a case of impetigo, also known as school sores, in our school. Impetigo is a contagious skin infection that can spread easily through contact with infected skin or shared items.

Symptoms:

Impetigo causes sores on the skin that may blister, then crust over, often with a honey-coloured appearance.

Contagious:

Impetigo is contagious as long as sores are weeping or crusty.

Importance of Treatment:

It's crucial to seek medical attention if you suspect your child has impetigo and follow your doctor's instructions, including

completing the full course of prescribed antibiotics.

Preventing Spread:

- Keep your child home from school until 24 hours after starting antibiotic treatment, or until the sores are dry and crusted over.
- Ensure any sores on exposed skin are covered with a waterproof dressing when your child is outside the home.
- Encourage frequent handwashing with soap and water, especially after touching the sores or other potentially contaminated surfaces.
- Discourage sharing items like towels, clothing, and utensils.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- What to do if you suspect your child has impetigo:
- See your doctor or healthcare provider for diagnosis and treatment.
- Follow their instructions carefully, including completing the full course of antibiotics.
- Keep your child home from school as instructed.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us prevent the spread of impetigo.


Alpine Camp 2025

At the end of Term 1, eight Middle and Senior School students took part in the Alpine 100 Ride – a 100km cycling camp for students from specialist schools across Victoria.

The group cycled along the Murray to the Mountains Rail Trail over two days. On Day 1, students rode from Beechworth to Myrtleford, tackling the challenging descent from Beechworth and the big climb over Taylors Gap with determination and focus. On Day 2, the group started in Harrietville and rode back to Myrtleford, beginning with a winding bush trail descent where riders demonstrated excellent control and handling through the tight, technical sections.

Emerson staff were especially impressed by the clear and consistent communication between students on the trail – calling out for oncoming traffic, signalling when slowing down or overtaking, and always looking out for one another to ensure everyone stayed safe throughout the ride.

Throughout the camp, students also showed fantastic teamwork – helping load and unload bikes from the trailer, supporting each other during rides, and working together to keep their cabins clean and organised. It was a huge achievement, and all students

Schools, the NDIS and your medical team work together to support your child with a disability.

WHAT IS THE NDIS?

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is an Australian Government scheme that funds supports to help individuals with a disability achieve their goals and build capacity.


THE NDIS?
To qualify for the NDIS you

must:

- Be an Australian Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Have a developmental delay under 7 years of age OR have a formal diagnosis of your disability over 7 years of age

WHY ACCESS THE NDIS?

The NDIS funds individual capacity building supports including speech pathology, occupational therapy, psychology and more. Accessing these services will support your child's development and assist to build independence.
