The first performance will be held on **Tuesday July 1**st at 9.30am for all **Senior students and staff to attend**.


The second performance will be held on **Tuesday July 1**st at 11:30am for all Middle students and staff.

#### Emerson School at Reconciliation Week 2025

Emerson School was honoured to be invited to participate in the City of Greater Dandenong's Reconciliation Week event, held at the Springvale Community Centre on June 3rd.

Many of our Koori students had the opportunity to attend this meaningful event.

Following registration, the day began with a Welcome to Country, a traditional Smoking Ceremony, and a series of speeches. Fortunately, the rain held off, allowing a large crowd to gather and take part. During the Smoking Ceremony, an Elder shared insights about the various materials used and the cultural significance of the ritual, explaining how to gain the most from the experience—an incredibly valuable learning moment for our students.

At 10:30 AM, we moved to Springvale City Hall to watch a performance by Ganga Giri. He demonstrated the use of different types of boomerangs and spoke about *Marngrook*, an early form of Australian rules football played by local Indigenous communities, using balls made from possum or kangaroo skins tied with sinews. Ganga also performed on the Yidaki (didgeridoo), a traditional instrument of the Yolngu people from eastern Arnhem Land.

A highlight of the performance was when Ganga invited our student Victor to join him on stage, his performance on the clapsticks was met with enthusiastic applause from the audience.

After the concert, students enjoyed morning tea near the library, followed by a collaborative art session led by artist N'Dene Riley. Students had the opportunity to contribute to a mural through drawing and painting. This artwork will be proudly displayed at the Dandenong Council offices.

It was a wonderful and enriching morning for everyone involved, full of learning, connection, and celebration of culture.

Big thankyou to Mrs Williams for her assistance. The food was a big hit, especially the Kangaroo meat.






#### **Emerson School Production 2025**

#### Information Regarding Fire at Hallam Retail and Warehouse Location

Last night, there was unfortunately a significant fire at our retail and warehouse location at 151-159 Princes Hwy, Hallam. As a result, we have lost a substantial amount of stock that was kept on-site and will not be able to operate out of our retail space. As this is very recent, we are still responding to the situation and working out the best approaches to ensure we can replenish the lost stock as quickly as we can. We will of course be endeavouring to resume retail operations as soon as possible, however at this stage we do not know what that will look like. We will provide updates on the situation as soon as we know more.

This will have the most noticeable impact on the schools that we sell to in our Hallam store, however as it is one of our primary warehousing locations as well, the loss of stock will impact all schools to a degree. We know that this is not an ideal situation, however we ask for your patience and understanding of any delays or stock shortages that result from this unprecedented situation. It is not a situation that can be prepared for in advance, but we will respond as thoroughly and as quickly as we can to each stock shortage.

We will be fulfilling orders as quickly as possible, however with the combination of pre-existing School Saving Bonus orders and the stock shortages resulting from this fire, please be advised that there may be significant wait times due to processing and production requirements.

We don't have any additional information at this stage but will provide further updates as soon as we know more. We'd like to thank you for your patience at this time.

### **CSEF & SSB**

#### **CSEF Application**

Parents who received CSEF in 2024, are not required to complete an application form for 2025, providing there has been no change to their family circumstances.

#### **New Families to Emerson School**

Any new families to Emerson School will be required to fill out the application form attached with a copy of your current Health Care Card, you will then need to hand it to the main office.

#### **CSEF Information**

Financial Assistance Information for Parents Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund, will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum. CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$154 for primary school students
 \$256 for secondary school students.

#### How to Apply:

You will need to provide a copy of your current Health Care Card with the application.

#### Claiming Your CSEF or SSB Benefit

You will be able to claim your CSEF or SSB on excursions when giving consent for events.



### School Saving Bonus reminder and allocation to school activities

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks until Monday 30 June 2025.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities. However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until late July.

To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the <u>SSB online system</u> and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025.

To learn more about the SSB online system, download the step-by-step <u>System guide for parents and carers (DOCX, 945KB)</u> or watch this <u>School Saving Bonus video</u>. <u>System guide translations</u> are also available in 14 languages.
