On Monday 3rd November, we will be conducting a Curriculum Day. This is the day before the Melbourne Cup Day designated public holiday. There will be no school for students on this day.


The first part of our Curriculum Day will feature the importance of Ethics in Educational Allied Facilities and Ethics in Education.




