Their very generous donation will go to the netball program at Emerson. We are all grateful for Sue, Ellen and Dalena's kindness and generosity.



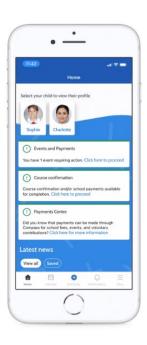

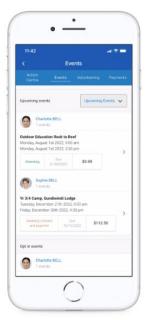


Compass for Parents has launched.
